

The Indonesia Future Cities Infrastructure Programme (FCIP)

Greening grey infrastructure to accelerate access to climate finance

FCIP is a central part of Melaju, the UK Indonesia Sustainable Infrastructure Platform. The 4 year programme supports green infrastructure projects across Indonesian cities.

FCIP works with the Government of Indonesia to delivering its climate adaptation and mitigation goals, supporting project preparation, and exploring funding and financing options for infrastructure that is 'green' or has the potential to be.

How will we achieve this?

FCIP provides two tracks of technical assistance: (1) ongoing support to select projects to accelerate financing of green infrastructure, and (2) city-level capacity building to financing climate infrastructure and to improve planning capabilities.

Priority Sectors for Year 2



Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) - Bali, Pekanbaru

Providing project preparation support and deepening city relationships for projects, and developing a BRT toolkit with the Ministry of Transportation to be distributed to cities across Indonesia.



Solid Waste Management (SWM) - Cilegon

Supporting urban landfill management and the financing of waste processing and waste-to-energy facilities.



Flood Management - Surabaya

Using Land Value Capture (LVC) as a mechanism to contribute to the funding of flood interventions (e.g. urban drainage, nature-based solutions in embankment).



GEDSI - Gender Equality, Disability, and Social Inclusion

GEDSI is mainstreamed across all priority sectors using GEDSI Lens Toolkit to ensure all interventions are responsive and inclusive to the needs of vulnerable and underrepresented groups from the earliest stage of project conception.

Year 2 Focus (June 25–June 26)

- Evaluation of project pipeline with multi sector support
- Institutional capacity building for climate and innovative infrastructure financing
- Progressing selected infrastructure projects towards financial close, and identifying projects for forthcoming support
- Considering adaptation as well as mitigation, where revenue streams are less established, but climate resilience potential is significant

Beyond Year 2, FCIP will continue to support 'greening infrastructure investment' and engage in earlier stage support to help 'green infrastructure design' through the lens of accelerating access to climate finance and delivering projects for cities.
